Ck soils: EAGLE FARM LANDSCAPE: residual low terraces and flood plains of alluvium from a time of higher sea level; duplex soils from mixed alluvia; coarse textured surface, yellow clay subsoil

<u>Ground Covers and Grasses: 0 - 1 metre and Vines</u>		
	Sarcophilus hillii	small orchid originally on trees; pendulous flowers stalks bearing fragrant white or pink blooms
blue flax lily	Dianella caerulea	fine lily of open eucalypt forest; blue flowers; bright blue berries; suit rockery or foreground planting
fish poison vine	Derris involuta	strong woody climber for a variety of soils; flowers profusely; Aboriginal use as fish poison
gristle fern	Blechnum cartilagineum	upright, hardy fern with a creeping rhizome; pink new growth; moist, open sites
head ache vine	Clematis glycinoides	vine of coastal sandy areas; crushed leaves contain an irritant said to cure head ache
matrush	Lomandra filiformis	hardy, grass-like understorey plant; spikes of delicate flowers in spring; suitable for rockeries
native jasmine	Jasminum simplicifolium	scrambling shrub of light rainforests; sprays of fragrant white flowers in Spring-Summer
river buttercup	Ranunculus inundatus	tufted plant with yellow flowers in September; colonises quickly; heavy moist sites in full sun
sarsaparilla vine	Hardenbergia violacea	fine scrambling hardy vine; deep purple pea flowers in late winter; will cover lattice-work
scrambling lily	Geitonoplesium cymosum	grassy-leaved scrambler; shiny black berry & dainty white, perfumed flowers; fresh shoots edible
<u>Low Shrubs: 1 - 2 metres</u>		
banana bush	Tabernaemontana pandacaqui	compact, low rainforest understorey shrub; large white, perfumed flowers; orange fruit
blue tongue	Melastoma affine	excellent understorey plant with large mauve flowers; best in moist site; edible fruit attract some birds
Brisbane laurel	Pittosporum revolutum	open shrub with cream flowers; evening fragrance; yellow fruit open to reveal red seeds; attracts birds
bushies' bootlace	Wikstroemia indica	low compact shrub; conspicuous in fruit; fine stems are wiry and resist snapping
false coffee bush	Breynia oblongifolia	small shrub with arching branches; small red-black fruit; open, well drained, moist site; butterflies
hop bush	Dodonaea triquetra	shrub with distinctive clusters of bronze hop-like fruit; partial shade; moist, well-drained position
pointed leaf hovea	Hovea acutifolia	fine open shrub; purple pea flowers in late winter; prefers filtered light, deeper soils
<u>Medium Shrubs: 2 - 5 metres</u>		
	Leptospermum whitei	beautiful, branched shrub from wetland heath communities; rough bark in strips; white flowers spring
geebung	Persoonia cornifolia	hardy shrub; upright habit; mid-green foliage; small, yellow fuschia-like flowers; yellow edible fruit
native hibiscus	Hibiscus heterophyllus	slender tall shrub; large white flowers with deep red throat; prickly stems
pavetta	Pavetta australiensis	tall shrub for sun or shade; clusters of fragrant flowers in Spring; deep fertile moist well drained soils
sweet susie	Canthium odoratum	thick shrub with trailing branches; dense panicles of dainty white flowers with intriguing scent
twiggy heath myrtle	Baeckea virgata	graceful, fine-leaved spreading shrub; prolific tiny white flowers in summer; constant moisture
white bottlebrush	Callistemon salignus	small bushy tree; new foliage pink; nectar-rich, cream brushes attract wildlife
<u>Small Trees: 5 - 10 metres</u>		
blackwood	Acacia melanoxylon	shapely, dense small tree; mid-green foliage; moist deep soils; cream pom-pom blossom in summer
broad-leaved paper bark	Melaleuca quinquenervia	hardy tree for damp sites; cream paper bark; cream brush flowers attract insects and birds
foambark tree	Jagera pseudorhus	dense tree with clean trunk; dark pinnate leaves; panicles of pink flowers; rusty coloured hairy fruit

grey myrtle, carol	<i>Backhousia myrtifolia</i>	small spreading understorey tree with small fragrant leaves & beautiful Summer flower clusters
hard quandong	<i>Elaeocarpus obovatus</i>	tree of creeksides; dense, mid-green foliage; clean grey trunk; small white flowers; small blue fruits
honey suckle oak	<i>Banksia integrifolia</i>	open shrub to small tree; lime-yellow honey-laden banksia brushes
macaranga	<i>Macaranga tanarius</i>	fast-growing shade tree with large glossy, heart-shaped leaves; suit rainforest planting
murrogun	<i>Cryptocarya microneura</i>	a tree in the natural creek-side community; dense, shiny-leaved form suits hedge; can be pruned
prickly pine	<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	tall, spiny shrub for well drained site; bushy growth harbours small birds; scented flowers; butterflies
red kamala	<i>Mallotus philippensis</i>	nicely shaped tree if grown in sun; can be pruned to give new reddish growth; velvety red fruit
swamp oak	<i>Casuarina glauca</i>	upright tree with dark green, pine-like foliage; produces a "sound of the wind"; needs moisture
tuckeroo	<i>Cupaniopsis anacardioides</i>	hardy, coastal tree; dense rounded crown of deep green foliage; masses of orange capsules
umbrella cheese tree	<i>Glochidion sumatranum</i>	fast growing tree with large soft leaves; moist, deep soils; edam cheese shaped fruit
Tall Trees: over 10 metres		
grey ironbark	<i>Eucalyptus siderophloia</i>	
forest red gum	<i>Eucalyptus tereticornis</i>	large trees for acreage or steep sites; comprised original canopy of the area; trunks a feature;
Moreton Bay ash	<i>Corymbia tessellaris</i>	provide food, nest and perch sites for varied native wildlife
scribbly gum	<i>Eucalyptus racemosa</i>	
pink bloodwood	<i>Corymbia intermedia</i>	
tallowwood	<i>Eucalyptus microcorys</i>	
small-leaved fig	<i>Ficus obliqua</i>	large spreading, shade tree; buttressed trunk; small shiny leaves; small orange fruit; invasive roots
smooth barked apple	<i>Angophora leiocarpa</i>	large gum-like tree; smooth, pink bark; flowers well; deep sandy well-drained soils; drops branches
white fig	<i>Ficus virens</i> var. <i>sublanceolata</i>	large, fast growing, deciduous fig with drooping foliage; aerial roots; frost tender; invasive roots
