

List 14**Chelmer - Clayfield - Corinda - Graceville - Oxley - Sherwood**^{11,12,38,40}

Co soils: "CORINDA" LANDSCAPE: Low hills of sandstones and clays, to 60 m above sea level, with rounded crests and gentle side slopes; soils are derived from a small area of basalt and deeply weathered sediments with local colluvium and alluvium; red earths are the major soils on the highest slopes.

Ground Covers and Grasses: 0 - 1 metre and Vines		
	<i>Tripladenia cunninghamii</i>	delicate groundcover with broad shiny leaves; mauve-pink flowers; shaded position
Brisbane lily	<i>Proiphys cunninghamii</i>	hardy bulb from hoop pine forests; large heart-shaped leaves annually; sprays of white flowers
grass lily	<i>Murdannia graminea</i>	tufted plant; grows naturally amongst native grasses; spikes of dainty lilac flowers after good rain
love flower	<i>Pseuderanthemum variabile</i>	low perennial herb; pastel coloured flowers after rain; suit large tubs, semi-shade; attracts butterflies
rasp fern	<i>Doodia aspera</i>	hardy, spreading, low-growing fern with pink new fronds; tolerates open crowded areas or shade
rough maidenhair	<i>Adiantum hispidulum</i>	hardy fern for semi-shade or large tubs; will tolerate some sun
scrambling lily	<i>Geitonoplesium cymosum</i>	grassy-leaved scrambler; shiny black berry & dainty, white, perfumed flowers; fresh shoots edible
winter apple	<i>Eremophila debilis</i>	spreading prostrate ground cover; pink flowers all year; edible red berries
yellow buttons	<i>Chrysocephalum apiculatum</i>	delicate little ground cover for sunny dry site; gold coloured pom-poms; foliage has silver undersides
Low Shrubs: 1 - 2 metres		
banana bush	<i>Tabernaemontana pandacaqui</i>	compact, low rainforest understorey shrub; large white, perfumed flowers; orange fruit
Brisbane laurel	<i>Pittosporum revolutum</i>	open shrub with cream flowers; evening fragrance; yellow fruit open to reveal red seeds; attracts birds
dogwood	<i>Jacksonia scoparia</i>	fine-leaved hardy shrub for sunny position, clusters of yellow pea flowers, porous soils
hop bush	<i>Dodonaea triquetra</i>	shrub with distinctive clusters of bronze hop-like fruit; partial shade; moist, well-drained position
native indigo	<i>Indigofera australis</i>	evergreen shrub; smooth spreading stems; profuse mauve-pink flowers in spring
Medium Shrubs: 2 - 5 metres		
broad-leaved boxwood	<i>Denhamia pittosporoides</i>	useful screen plant; lush green foliage with plentiful orange fruit; from dry rainforest
green kamala	<i>Mallotus laoxyloides</i>	"smell of the bush" shrub for understorey in rainforest garden; male & female plants
grey myrtle, carroll	<i>Backhousia myrtifolia</i>	small spreading understorey tree with small leaves; fragrant foliage & beautiful flowers
Leichardt's ironwood	<i>Bridelia leichhardtii</i>	hardy tree for slopes; dense rounded canopy; numerous red and black berries attract wildlife
native hibiscus	<i>Hibiscus heterophyllus</i>	slender tall shrub; large white flowers with deep red throat; prickly stem
scrub ironwood	<i>Austromyrtus acmenoides</i>	small tree; attractive flowers; fruit attracts birds; locally endangered
Small Trees: 5 - 10 metres		
bat's wing coral	<i>Erythrina vespertilio</i>	distinctive tree from the ridges; bat's wing leaf shape; spines on trunk; orange-red pea flowers
celery wood	<i>Polyscias elegans</i>	handsome shade tree; long pinnate leaves; fast growing pioneer in rich, moist soils; draws wildlife
hairy bird's eye	<i>Alectryon tomentosus</i>	hardy, slow growing, ornamental tree; rounded crown in the open; colourful autumn fruits attract birds
hard quandong	<i>Elaeocarpus obovatus</i>	tree of creeksides; dense, mid-green foliage; clean grey trunk; small white flowers; small blue fruits

kurrajong	<i>Brachychiton populneus</i>	medium tree for specimen; white flowers; distinctive seed pods; seeds used for coffee substitute
native quince	<i>Guioa semiglauc</i>	arching tree with mottled, pale-coloured smooth bark; leaves pale underneath; host tree for epiphytes
river or black tea tree	<i>Melaleuca bracteata</i>	shapely, fine-leaved tree of varied height; profuse small brush flowers attract wildlife; moist deep soil
small-leaved tuckeroo	<i>Cupaniopsis parvifolia</i>	slow growing, hardy tree; stiff shiny deep green foliage; masses of hairy orange capsules in summer
weeping bottlebrush	<i>Callistemon viminalis</i>	small rounded tree of weeping habit; prolific red bottlebrush flowers attract birds; moist sites
woody pear	<i>Mischocarpus pyriformis</i>	small tree with rounded canopy; glossy leaves; small pear-shaped fruit; deep, moist, sandy soils
<u>All trees: over 10 metres</u>		
broad-leaved red ironbark	<i>Eucalyptus fibrosa</i>	
spotted gum	<i>Corymbia citriodora</i>	
scribbly gum	<i>Eucalyptus racemosa</i>	large trees for acreage or steep sites; comprised original canopy of the area; trunks a feature;
forest red gum	<i>Eucalyptus tereticornis</i>	
small fruited grey gum	<i>Eucalyptus propinqua</i>	provide food, nest and perch sites for numerous and varied native wildlife
pink bloodwood	<i>Corymbia intermedia</i>	
white mahogany	<i>Eucalyptus carnea</i>	
grey ironbark	<i>Eucalyptus siderophloia</i>	
crow's ash	<i>Alindesia australis</i>	large timber tree suit specimen; panicles of white flowers; woody fruit opens into five woody sections
hoop pine	<i>Araucaria cunninghamii</i>	large conifer; deep green foliage in crowded branchlets; horizontal branches; female cones 10 cm
ignum vitae, satinwood	<i>Premna lignum-vitae</i>	shapely timber tree for deep, moist soils; large shady tree; fleshy red fruit; pink flowers all year
small-leaved fig	<i>Ficus obliqua</i>	large spreading, shade tree; buttressed trunk; small shiny leaves; small orange fruit; invasive roots
smoothbark apple	<i>Angophora leiocarpa</i>	large gum-like tree; smooth, pink bark; flowers white; deep sandy well-drained soils; drops branches
white fig	<i>Ficus virens</i> var. <i>subanceolata</i>	large, fast growing, deciduous fig with drooping foliage; aerial roots; frost tender; invasive roots
