L soil: "LOGAN" LANDSCAPE: Alluvial soils on sets of low discontinuous terraces on Enoggera/Breakfast Creek becoming acid with a clay subsoil in the downstream plains

Common Name	Botanical Name	Features
<u>Ground Covers and Grasses: 0 - 1 metre and Vines</u>		
blue flax lily	<i>Dianella longifolia</i>	small lily of open eucalypt forest; blue flowers; bright blue berries; suit rockery or foreground planting
boobialla	<i>Myoporum acuminatum</i>	sprawling shrub from sandy coastal areas; small white bearded tubular flowers throughout the year
Brisbane lily	<i>Proiphys cunninghamii</i>	hardy bulb from riverside forests; large heart-shaped leaves annually; sprays of white flowers
climbing maidenhair fern	<i>Lygodium microphyllum</i>	soft rambling fern easily grown in pot or sheltered moist position in open ground; frost hardy
coral fern	<i>Gleichenia dicarpa</i>	hardy rambling fern for sheltered, moist areas; forms lacy tangled clumps
gristle fern	<i>Blechnum cartilagineum</i>	upright, hardy fern with a creeping rhizome; pink new growth; moist, open sites
kangaroo grass	<i>Themeda triandra</i>	wide-spread grass of the eucalypt forest; fine foliage; spikes of coppery seed heads in summer
native plumbago	<i>Plumbago zeylanica</i>	low, straggling shrub to 1 m; needs sheltered site and other shrubs for support; white-blue flowers
native yam	<i>Dioscorea transversa</i>	rainforest vine with deeply veined heart-shaped leaves; winged fruits in conspicuous clusters
river lily	<i>Crinum pedunculatum</i>	large robust lily; white flowers; potential feature plant; prefers shaded areas with some moisture
spiny head matrush	<i>Lomandra longifolia</i>	large grassy clumps common on creek banks; flowers have evening perfume; butterflies
swamp water fern	<i>Blechnum indicum</i>	upright hardy understorey fern of paperbark lowlands; open graceful form; edible starchy root
wonga vine	<i>Pandorea pandorana</i>	vigorous twining vine in shaded forest situation; ferny foliage; large sprays of small trumpet flowers
<u>Low Shrubs: 1 - 2 metres</u>		
banana bush	<i>Tabernaemontana pandacaqui</i>	compact, low rainforest understorey shrub; large white, perfumed flowers; orange fruit
broad palm lily	<i>Cordyline petiolaris</i>	upright branched cane with large broad leaves; moist shaded areas; sprays of pale flowers; red fruit
false coffee bush	<i>Breynia oblongifolia</i>	small shrub with arching branches; small red-black fruit; open, well drained, moist site; butterflies
hop bush	<i>Dodonaea triquetra</i>	shrub with distinctive clusters of bronze hop-like fruit; partial shade; moist, well-drained position
pointed leaf hovea	<i>Hovea acutifolia</i>	fine open shrub; purple pea flowers in late winter; prefers filtered light, deeper soils
<u>Medium Shrubs: 2 - 5 metres</u>		
grey myrtle, carol	<i>Backhousia myrtifolia</i>	small spreading understorey tree with small leaves; fragrant foliage & beautiful flowers
lolly bush	<i>Clerodendrum floribundum</i>	small ornamental tree; white perfumed flowers; black & red fruits a feature
native hibiscus	<i>Hibiscus heterophyllum</i>	slender tall shrub; large white flowers with deep red throat; prickly stems
sweet susie	<i>Canthium odoratum</i>	thick shrub with trailing branches; dense panicles of dainty white flowers with intriguing scent
turkey bush	<i>Grewia latifolia</i>	open twiggy shrub from areas of deeper well drained soils; small red fruit have purgative powers

white bottlebrush

Callistemon salignus

small bushy tree; new foliage pink; nectar-rich, cream brushes attract wildlife

Small Trees: 5 - 10 metres

bat's wing coral

Erythrina vespertilio

distinctive tree from the ridges; bat's wing leaf shape; spines on trunk; orange-red pea flowers

blackwood

Acacia melanoxylon

shapely, dense small tree; mid-green foliage; moist deep soils; cream pom-pom blossom in summer

broad-leaved paper bark

Melaleuca quinquenervia

hardy tree for damp sites; cream paper bark; cream brush flowers attract insects and birds

brown kurrajong

Commersonia bartramia

slender tree near creek edges; broad-leaved, layered canopy; blossom gives appearance of snow;

hard quandong

Elaeocarpus obovatus

tree of creeksides; dense, mid-green foliage; clean grey trunk; small white flowers; small blue fruits

quinine berry

Petalostigma pubescens

small tree with dense canopy; small shiny leaves; bitter orange berries; sunny, well drained position

scrub ironbark

Bridelia exaltata

dense tree from damp hillsides; shiny green leaves; yellow fruit attracts wildlife

swamp box

Lophostemon suaveolens

fast growing eucalypt-like tree with graceful branch form; open canopy; frequent flowering periods

swamp oak

Casuarina glauca

upright tree with dark green, pine-like foliage; produces a "sound of the wind"; needs moisture

tuckeroo

Cupaniopsis anacardioides

hardy, coastal tree; dense rounded crown of deep green foliage; masses of orange capsules

weeping bottlebrush

Callistemon viminalis

small rounded tree of weeping habit; prolific red bottlebrush flowers attract birds; moist sites

white bolly gum

Neolitsea dealbata

understorey shrub; slender trunk with arching branches; silver-pink new growth; blue triangle butterfly

Tall Trees: over 10 metres

Brisbane brush box

Lophostemon confertus

large tree with deep-green horizontal foliage; bare pink bark in upper branches; favours South slopes

dune cypress

Callitris columellaris

bulky tree with fine, deep green cypress foliage which conceals the straight trunk; knotty timber

Bancroft's red gum

Eucalyptus bancroftii

grey ironbark

Eucalyptus siderophloia

forest red gum

Eucalyptus tereticornis

Moreton Bay ash

Eucalyptus tessellaris

scribbly gum

Eucalyptus racemosa

pink bloodwood

Corymbia intermedia

tallowwood

Eucalyptus microcorys

narrow-leaved red gum

Eucalyptus seeana

large trees for acreage or steep sites; comprised original canopy of the area; trunks a feature; provide food, nest, perch and roost sites for varied native wildlife

crow's ash

Flindersia australis

large timber tree suit specimen; panicles of white flowers; woody fruit opens into five woody sections

small-leaved fig

Ficus obliqua

large spreading, shade tree; buttressed trunk; small shiny leaves; small orange fruit; invasive roots

smoothbark apple

Angophora leiocarpa

large gum-like tree; smooth, pink bark; flowers well; deep sandy well-drained soils; drops branches

strangler fig

Ficus watkinsiana

large, buttressed tree; small shiny leaf; spotted black fruit attracts fruit bats and birds; roots invasive

white fig

Ficus virens var. *sublanceolata*

large, fast growing, deciduous fig with drooping foliage; aerial roots; frost tender; invasive roots
