L soils: "LOGAN" LANDSCAPE: Alluvial soils on sets of low discontinuous terraces of Enoggera/Breakfast Creek becoming acid with a clay subsoil in the downstream plains

<u>Ground Covers and Grasses: 0 - 1 metre and Vines</u>		
blue flax lily	<i>Dianella longifolia</i>	small lily of open eucalypt forest; blue flowers; bright blue berries; suit rockery or foreground planting
boobialla	<i>Myoporum acuminatum</i>	sprawling shrub from sandy coastal areas; small white bearded tubular flowers throughout the year
gristle fern	<i>Blechnum cartilagineum</i>	upright, hardy fern with a creeping rhizome; pink new growth; moist, open sites
guinea flower	<i>Hibbertia linearis</i>	compact low shrub with fine leaves; bright yellow flowers; suit rockery site with leaf mould
kangaroo grass	<i>Themeda triandra</i>	wide-spread grass of the eucalypt forest; fine foliage; coppery seed heads in summer
native plumbago	<i>Plumbago zeylanica</i>	low, straggling shrub to 1 m; needs sheltered site and other shrubs for support; white-blue flowers
scrambling lily	<i>Geitonoplesium cymosum</i>	grassy-leaved scrambler; shiny black berry & dainty, white, perfumed flowers; fresh shoots edible
soft bracken	<i>Culcita dubia</i>	lush lacy fern for deeper well drained soils; dappled light and sheltered position; slowly spreads
spiny head matrush	<i>Lomandra longifolia</i>	large grassy clumps common on creek banks; flowers have evening perfume; butterflies
wonga vine	<i>Pandorea pandorana</i>	vigorous twining vine in shaded forest situation; ferny foliage; large sprays of small trumpet flowers
<u>Low Shrubs: 1 - 2 metres</u>		
banana bush	<i>Tabernaemontana pandacaqui</i>	compact, low rainforest understorey shrub; large white, perfumed flowers; orange fruit
Brisbane laurel	<i>Pittosporum revolutum</i>	open shrub with cream flowers; evening fragrance; yellow fruit open to reveal red seeds; attracts birds
crinkle bush	<i>Lomatia silaifolia</i>	decorative open shrub; intricate foliage; white, grevillea-like flowers; moist, well-drained soil
false coffee bush	<i>Breynia oblongifolia</i>	small shrub with arching branches; small red-black fruit; open, well drained, moist site; butterflies
hop bush	<i>Dodonaea triquetra</i>	shrub with distinctive clusters of bronze hop-like fruit; partial shade; moist, well-drained position
pointed leaf hovea	<i>Hovea acutifolia</i>	fine open shrub; purple pea flowers in late winter; prefers filtered light, deeper soils
turkey bush	<i>Grewia latifolia</i>	open twiggy shrub from areas of deeper well drained soils; small red fruit have purgative powers
<u>Medium Shrubs: 2 - 5 metres</u>		
Brisbane wattle	<i>Acacia fimbriata</i>	graceful open tree with drooping foliage; lemon pom-pom blossom; fast growing but short lived
grey myrtle, carol	<i>Backhousia myrtifolia</i>	small spreading understorey tree with small leaves; fragrant foliage & beautiful flowers
hickory wattle	<i>Acacia penninervis</i>	large shrub; compact shape in open area; pale yellow pom-pom flowers throughout summer
lolly bush	<i>Clerodendrum floribundum</i>	small ornamental tree; white perfumed flowers; black & red fruits a feature
white bottlebrush	<i>Callistemon salignus</i>	small bushy tree; new foliage pink; nectar-rich, cream brushes attract wildlife
wild may	<i>Leptospermum attenuatum</i>	slender, graceful shrub, small white flowers in spring; scaly bark peels in strips

Small Trees: 5 - 10 metres

hard quandong	<i>Elaeocarpus obovatus</i>
prickly pine	<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>

scrub ironwood	<i>Choricarpia leptopetala</i>
swamp box	<i>Lophostemon suaveolens</i>
swamp oak	<i>Casuarina glauca</i>

pink bloodwood	<i>Corymbia intermedia</i>
tallowwood	<i>Eucalyptus microcorys</i>
narrow-leaved red gum	<i>Eucalyptus seeana</i>

small-leaved fig	<i>Ficus obliqua</i>

white fig	<i>Ficus virens</i> var. <i>sublanceolata</i>

shapely, dense small tree; mid-green foliage; moist deep soils; cream pom-pom blossom in summer
slender tree near creek edges; broad-leaved, layered canopy; blossom gives appearance of snow;
tree of creeksides; dense, mid-green foliage; clean grey trunk; small white flowers; small blue fruits
tall, spiny shrub for well drained site; bushy growth harbours small birds; scented flowers; butterflies
small tree with dense canopy; small shiny leaves; bitter orange berries; sunny, well drained position
dense tree from damp hillsides; shiny green leaves; yellow fruit attracts wildlife
dry rainforest timber tree with rusty new growth; cream pom-pom blossom in spring-summer
fast growing eucalypt-like tree with graceful branch form; open canopy; frequent flowering periods
upright tree with dark green, pine-like foliage; produces a "sound of the wind"; needs moisture
hardy, coastal tree; dense rounded crown of deep green foliage; masses of orange capsules

large tree with deep-green horizontal foliage; bare pink bark in upper branches; favours South slopes

large trees for acreage or steep sites; comprised original canopy of the area; trunks a feature;
provide food and nest and perch sites for varied native wildlife

specimen tree; large pinnate leaves; panicles of fragrant, white flowers; large, woody capsules
large timber tree suit specimen; panicles of white flowers; woody fruit opens into five woody sections
hardy tree for damp sites; cream paper bark; cream brush flowers attract insects and birds
large spreading, shade tree; buttressed trunk; small shiny leaves; small orange fruit; invasive roots
large gum-like tree; smooth, pink bark; flowers well; deep sandy well-drained soils; drops branches
large spreading tree with weeping form; small leaves; creek banks or large garden only; invasive roots
large, fast growing, deciduous fig with drooping foliage; aerial roots; frost tender; invasive roots
